Greetings Nobles, summer has flown by and we are now preparing for fall and some outstanding colors appearing, making our landscape more beautiful and making us realize this could only happen thru the Great Creator, get out and enjoy the season. Fall is another time to prepare for winter and that dreaded word SNOW, make sure those snow throwers are working and you have enough melting salt, prepare your auto for those winter months with oil change, battery checks, wiper and fluid checks, you will be glad you did. Al Koran has been called back to labor and we are continuing to work for you the members who make up this great fraternity. The Divan has approved a one time petition fee of \$50 until December 31 to become a member of Al Koran, however you must attend our winter ceremonial in December, this petition fee will also cover your 2017 dues.

I must remind all that with fall and winter fast approaching so will your dues statements for the 2017 year. The by-laws section 332.2 require all members to pay annually the amount set by the Temple which at Al Koran is \$137.00 which includes your per-capita amount to Imperial and your hospital assessment going to the hospital fund in Tampa. The dues amount MUST be paid before January 1 of each year. You must also keep your membership in your Blue Lodge in order to remain a member of any Shrine Center. Nobles, we all face hardships along the road of life and if you are facing those at this time and find yourself unable to pay dues please call us here at the office and speak to me, we can remit some portion of those dues and keep you in good standing, it only takes a phone call or note to my attention. Your dues statement will be coming from Tampa again this year and will be mailed out in September to reach you before you head south for the winter. The envelope may look like a fund raising appeal so please open it to make sure it is your 2017 dues statement. Payments will still be mailed to Al Koran and Tampa is issuing a hard membership card similar to credit card and will be used for the next 5 years with stickers after the initial cards are sent. There have been some issues with our 2016 dues cards and the bugs have been somewhat worked out according to Tampa, if your dues card is not correct please give me a call in the office so I can request a replacement. I am working on updating our web-fez data base, you can help by completing ALL information on your dues statement and please include your Blue Lodge information so I can add that to your record as well.

We have 90 Nobles who have not paid 2016 dues and will be suspended at the end of 2017 as we are not permitted to carry any member in arrears for over two years, if you are one of those 90 Nobles please speak to me for a solution to getting you current. If you know a Noble who may be having difficulty in paying dues or may have passed away please give me a call so we can adjust their records.

Nobles we have been busy here planning activities for all our members and we need you to be part of them, please come out and support your shrine Center, MAKE THE EFFORT you will be glad you did.

Erie Shriners Jammers Season Underway

Shriners Hospitals for Children — Erie's Wheelchair Basketball Team, Erie Shriners Jammers, are halfway through their 6 week season and participation has been outstanding. The program, which began about 10 years ago, allows physically disabled children the opportunity to compete on the court against a team from the Erie community. The patients who participate in this program recognize many benefits including in-creased self confidence, learning to be part of a team and learning to play by the rules. One parent commented "My child benefits from the socialization and being around other kids who are similar to him. His self confidence has soared!"
