What's New in Erie!

Erie Medical Center Celebrates 90 Years

In 2017, Shriners Hospitals for Children – Erie will celebrate 90 years of car-ing for kids. Indeed, one only has to look at the Erie medical center's rich past to understand why its staff and patients are looking forward to an exciting future.

Where It Began

"Sunshine Valley Camp" is where the Shriners Hospitals for Children — Erie story begins. In the summer of 1924, a cottage was built to treat 12 children to a summer of sunshine, good food and physical therapy. The evolution from a summer cottage for 12 to a state-of-the-art, pediatric orthopaedic healthcare facility, complete with surgical services and a residency program, has spanned a peri-od of 90 years. Those years of birth, growth and change began with a sugges-tion from a young Erie woman, Elizabeth Milne, which was acted on by local Shriners in the same spirit that prevails among them today.

According to Shriners, the success of that first summer greatly enthused the Nobility of Zem Zem Temple and at a Ceremonial held October 30, 1924, No-ble Isador Sobel introduced a resolution to "build and maintain a convalescent home for crippled children." After the Temple unanimously adopted the resolution, construction began in October 1925 under the Potentate of Zem Zem Temple, Emil E. Knobloch. A completed Zem Zem Hospital for Crippled Children was dedicated on June 26, 1927. The original hospital had 48 beds and treated children from nine counties in northwestern Pennsylvania. "Those first years saw cases of polio, tu-berculosis and hip dislocation," says Administrator Mary Jane Antoon. "The hospital was especially busy during the early 1950s with as many as 60 polio patients being cared for at one time."



As the incidence of polio and tuberculosis decreased, the focus of the hospi-tal's treatment program broadened and shifted to meet the needs of other children in the area. To this end, in 1967, the Zem Zem Hospital joined the national network of Shriners Hospitals for Children.

New Era

As medical treatment protocols and the needs of its patients changed, the leadership at Shriners Hospitals for Children – Erie made the decision to transition the facility from an inpatient hospital to a multi-faceted ambulatory medical center.

On April 24, 2012, while re-maining part of the Shriners Hospitals for Children system, the facility be-

came known as the Erie Ambulatory Surgery Center and Outpatient Special-ty Care Center. "The Erie medical cen-ter is the first facility in the Shriners Hospitals for Children system to un-dergo this transformation and is serv-ing as a model for other Shriners hos-pitals that will be making this same transition in the next few years," An-toon explains.

Shriners Hospitals for Children – Erie Ambulatory Surgery Center and Out-patient Specialty Care Center continues to provide the best pediatric orthopaedic/neuromuscular medical care available. Currently, the medical center serves thou-sands of children from six states (New York, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Ohio, Maryland and Michigan) and the Province of Ontario with medical services deliv-ered regardless of the family's ability to pay. Fourteen Shrine Temples are affiliated with and support Erie Shriners Medical Center.

Throughout its history, Shriners Hospitals for Children - Erie, has helped children with complex orthopaedic conditions defy the odds and lead healthy, pros-perous lives. "The 'Sunshine Valley Camp' has come a long way," notes Antoon, "but the vision 'to transform children's lives by providing exceptional health care,' has not wavered.

Sunshine Chairman Emil Arvidson has informed me that as of this writing (January 5) that sick bay is empty. Keep up the good health!


There will be no Mariners meeting in February. Instead the Mariners will be doing some ice fishing on Lake Erie.

The Blossom That Duped Hitler

There is a blossom that is truly aptly named... and what is it called? It is the "Forget-Me-Not". This has a most meaningful connotation for we members of the Nobility through our Masonic ties.

The Forget-Me-Not was adopted by the Grand Lodge of Germany as a symbol of identification in commemoration of the historic efforts of the Masonic Order in the infamous year of 1936.

In 1936 Hitler dissolved all the Blue Lodges throughout Germany, confiscating the [property of the members and the lodges, placing thousands in the concentration camps... most of whom were sent to Buchenwald and Orienburg. To wear a blue Lodge emblem was to sign your own death warrant.

The Grand Master of Germany suggested to the Three and a half Million Members of the Masonic Lodges that a means of identity be found other than the usual emblem. His suggestion was to use the inconspicuous appearing flower of the Forget-Me-Not plant. This then became the secret means of identification among the members. The blossom was so small that it went unnoticed and unreported to Hitler's Gestapo.

After Germany was liberated from the tyranny of Hitler, Blue Lodges blossomed almost overnight with unprecedented rate of growth in membership. Each member of the Masonic Order in Germany wears proudly a small Forget-Me-Not button. This is to him a constant reminder that they are free. More importantly, it tells the to forget-them-not...those that died because they were members of their Masonic Lodges.

Hundreds of Masons were shot after the abortive uprising in July of 1944 when Count von Stauffenberg, with a handful of courageous high officers of the German Wehrmacht attempted to kill Hitler ... and failed.

The reason given for the senseless murder of those shot in the courtyards of the Ploezensee Prison was a trumped up charge that they were a part of the conspiracy of the officers in revolt to overthrow the Nazis.

Any noble visiting Germany today should be on the look-out for this tiny Forget-Me-Not button in the lapel of the men. It will signify to you the presence of a fellow traveler. To those who visit a blue Lodge while in Germany will be given a Forget-Me-Not button. This is to remind us of the liberty and freedom we enjoy and so many take for granted... to guard these things and if necessary, to defend them. And, we too must Forget-Me-Not.

Hunters

Greetings Nobles,

January has made its escape and into the history books with the Inauguration of a new President of the United States. Winter has not been too terrible but February and March may be a different story. Nobles, Lodge inspections around our jurisdiction have stated and if you have not attended your Lodge in recent years please make a visit. Al Koran has started another interesting year with many planned activities for you and your families please watch the future issues of our magazine for details and plan to attend.

Nobles, the 2017 dues statements have been mailed from Tampa and if you have not received yours please give me a call in the office, I have been informed several have NOT received a dues statement if you are one please give me a call in the office and I will mail you one if needed, I will do my best to get them to you quickly. There are still 275 who have not paid 2017 dues. You do not need your statement to pay your dues, they remain at \$137.00, you can send them to my attention in the office, please include your member number on check. The 2017 dues card stickers are also being sent from Tampa and should be arriving to those who have paid their dues shortly, if you do not have a plastic card call me in the office and I can order a replacement. Al Koran does not have these cards; both these items were provided by Imperial to help all Shrine Centers save postage costs. There are 195 Shrine Centers in USA and over 300,000 members so it is a great effort to make sure the statements, cards and stickers are sent correctly and they rely on the Recorders to provide correct information. I have received several back via return mail which was sent to the address on file, if you have moved or are a snowbird, please inform me of your new address and also address of your winter months so communications are not lost, thank you in advance for complying.

As 2016 concludes the annual reports were filed and some interesting facts about Al Koran. We started the 2016 year with 1181 regular members and 4 associate members for total of 1185 members. During 2016 we created 22, restored 9, affiliated 1 and made 1 associate member for total of 33, however we lost 71 to suspension (NPD or pre-req. body suspension), and 53 to death for total of 124 and a NET LOSS of 91, our membership as of December 31, 2016 was 1086 regular and 4 associate for total of 1190. Thanks to the hard work of our membership committee. Nobles please do your part to remain a member of Al Koran, if you are experiencing hardships please call the office and we will provide suggestions for dues payments, also be on the lookout for new members, petitions will be available on line. Requirements remain must be Master Mason in good standing. Please MAKE THE EFFORT to attend one meeting or event during 2017, you will be surprised of the changes, the officers have pledged to improve our meetings and events so come out and be part of the exciting 2017 Shrine year. Please call the office for all reservations. I look forward to working with all of you and the continuing challenges of this office.
