From the Potentate

As of June 28, 2018, the City of Broadview Heights, placed notice upon the building to the effect that, due to safety violations, no admittance to these premises will be allowed, and that anyone found in the building would be subject to arrest.

Not to worry! The Board of Directors (your Divan) has been preparing for just such a situation. We are still operating out of an alternate location and have taken steps to find a more permanent temporary location. Yes, things here have been challenging, however, we have no costs for rent, or utilities when we can get them. This is one of the primary reasons our budget is in the black.

Fortunately, the immediate needs of Al Koran are such that we have about a two month stretch where we have no significant need of the premises. Our office (phones, mail, and email) continue to operate.

I can assure you that when we return in the fall you will all be made aware of where we will meet, and that operations will continue as usual. **However, to the Clubs and units that make regular use of the facility, and who may have events scheduled there, even those later in the year, I would immediately seek another location in which to hold your event. It is my opinion that access to the building will remain restricted for a significant amount of time.**

Thanks to all those participating in our parades, headquarters as well as our clubs and units, you are all doing a fantastic job of keeping the Shriner's, and our hospitals alive and well.

We have our work cut out for us and need your help. We need you to sell your Sportsman's Raffle tickets, and we need you for help find new members.

Also, stay informed, additional updates regarding the building, as well as future events for Al Koran, our club and unit, will be forthcoming.

Remember Al Koran is the fourth oldest Shrine Center, with a fabled and storied history, to which all of you have contributed, please continue to help in keeping this great legacy alive and well. Enjoy your summer and get ready for a fun filled fall.

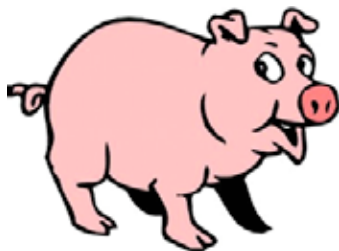

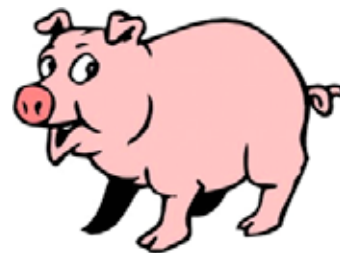
