## From the Recorder - Tom Klecan PP

## Using My FezCard Viewer on iPhones (iOS 18.1.1)

In August 2024, an update was pushed to iPhone users to install the new iOS 18.0, which updated the operating system and apps installed on the iPhone. Many Nobles experienced issues where the *My FezCard Viewer* app would not load properly; the phone often

displayed a "blank" or "white" screen instead of the usual digital membership card. With the release of iOS 18.0.1, the issue was resolved — with a specific caveat. Now, Nobles will need to rotate their phones to "landscape orientation" for the digital membership card to load. *And, with the release of iOS 18.1.1, an additional point was made, that the users should rotate their phones such that the line on the screen is at the TOP of the screen.* Doing so will force-load 1the digital card.

If you are an iPhone user, are using the latest iOS version and are still experiencing issues, please follow the instructions below.

1) If you encounter a white, or "blank" screen, rotate the phone to position the line at the top of the screen.

If this does not display the digital card"

- Uninstall My FezCard Viewer from your phone, and reinstall it through the Apple Store (to ensure that you have the latest/most up-to-date version available).
- Register, using your Shrine ID (not your Member Number), your Last Name and your Temple of *primary* membership (not Associate).
- 3) Click "Register."
- 4) Rotate your phone, per above.

## A few things you may or may not have known about your Shrine Hospitals.

- 1. Shriner's first hospital(s) was (were) originally opened up to treat polio, and Shriners actually developed two polio vaccines.
- 2. Did you know that Shriners treats 15% of all pediatric spinal cord injuries In the United States?
- 3. Did you know that almost every burn surgeon now practicing in the US was trained at Shriners? In fact, most of the burn surgeons now practicing anywhere in the world were trained at Shriners.
- 4.Do you know why our advertisements indicate that we treat any child regardless of the family's ability to pay because if we said 'we would not take you to collection' it would be illegal to do so?
- 5. Did you know that when you call a Shrine Hospital for care, if we cannot provide the services you are looking for, we will direct you to a facility that will.
- 6.Do you know why has Shriners been transitioning from hospitals to ambulatory surgical centers and clinics? It is because in patient pediatrics, actually most inpatient stuff, is all decreasing, what is increasing is outpatient care. This coupled with a decline in the pediatric population in the United States, is why. Where is the pediatric population growing, well generally everywhere else in the world.
- 7. Did you know that SHC looked into expanding our treatments focuses? They looked into other new fields of care such as autism and behavior health. But the research conducted indicated that taking on any of these would put us completely out of business within 10 years.

## Milli finds hope, plan for future at Shriners Children's Ohio





Fifteen-year-old Milli isn't shy about showing her scars from a serious burn injury.

"It's part of my story," she said. "They don't define who I am, but they do show how strong I am and what I've been through."

Milli was using a table-top fire pit in July 2024 when her clothing and hair caught fire. She was rushed to Shriners Children's Ohio with burns to her arms, face, neck and chest. Initially she was worried about how she would look as she healed, but Milli said she eventually realized she wasn't going to be scared, instead she was going to embrace her looks.

"I think my scars are cool," she said. "I can't take back what happened, but I can still live my life the way I want to."

"Living her life" includes playing basketball, hanging out with her friends, and riding roller coasters. Milli credits her positive attitude to her care team.

"They were so kind and accepting," she explained. "They told me what I needed to do to get better and encouraged me to meet my goals." Milli was so inspired by physical therapist Jenni that she's considering becoming one herself.

"Jenni knew how much to push me on hard days," Milli said. "I want to give back and use my experience to help other burn survivors get their life back."





## Patient Ambassador Morgan triumphs over adversity, Aims for Collegiate Softball Scholarship

Shriners Children's Erie patient Morgan lost her right arm and leg in an accident at 2 years old, but that hasn't stopped her from pursuing a scholarship to play softball on the collegiate level.

The 16-year-old high school sophomore, who plays softball with a prosthetic leg, is preparing for the spring sports season to start heating up.

Morgan plays first base and bats for her high school, making her an important piece of the Eisenhower Lady Knights softball team. She also plays for a competitive travel softball team, something her mom said she never thought would be possible after her injuries.



"Sometimes I have to find different ways to do things than other players, but I always do," Morgan said. "You just have to think outside the box. I work hard to keep up with everyone and think of ways to modify my game. For example, I used to bat from the left-handed side of the plate, but I always got underneath the ball and hit a lazy pop-up or struck out. Last summer I decided to try hitting as a right-hander. In my travel softball season, I only had around six strikeouts in hundreds of at-bats. It's just one way I've learned to adapt over the years."

Morgan and her parents said Shriners Children's has been there for Morgan throughout her childhood. Shriners Children's helped Morgan learn to walk, and Morgan underwent multiple surgeries with the healthcare system while growing up, ensuring she could continue to play sports and grow in a healthy manner. Morgan has also received prosthetics from Shriners Children's throughout her life, fondly remembering the designs she was able to put on her various prosthetics.

"We couldn't have asked for better care at Shriners Children's," Morgan's mom Melody said. "They got Morgan up and walking in no time. If it wasn't for Shriners Children's, I really don't know where we would have gone after the accident. Shriners Children's always helped us find those different avenues for Morgan to play sports. They steered us to adaptive skiing and always encouraged Morgan to try new things."

Morgan said playing sports as an amputee can be very hard at times. However, she hopes she's setting an example all athletes can follow, about how to embrace and push through any challenges.

"It'll be a huge accomplishment for me if I'm able to play on the collegiate level," Morgan said. "I know I've already gotten some looks from college programs, and I'm working hard toward earning a scholarship to play softball."




