From the Recorder

Last month was all about Imperial Session, but this month, and most likely for the remainder of the year it is going to be on dues. Especially delinquent dues.

Nobles, dues are just a part of Masonry. First thanks to all of you who pay regularly and timely. I try to keep up on dues regularly for several reasons. No one likes getting another reminder to pay their dues, especially if they already have, and it saves us (and Imperial) money.

I know I have mentioned this before but I still get quite a few questions about it. Al Koran (and Shriners International) does not automatically remit a senior member's dues. Each Shrine Center has its own way of handling that situation. At Al Koran we expect all those who are members to pay their dues. That being said we are not insensitive to those of members, senior or not, who for whatever reason are having trouble paying their dues.

Al Koran would like to keep all of our members, who wish to remain members. We have, and will continue to, assist members who are experiencing challenges in paying their dues. We also understand that many of you can no longer participate in many of our regular activities. We have assisted other members in retaining their membership at reduced costs of dues, and maybe able to assist you too.

Please remember that as a member of Al Koran, we pay a per capita to Imperial on your behalf as well as the hospital assessment. Of your \$157.00 in dues \$50.00 goes for per capita and another \$5.00 for the Hospitals.

While we would prefer to keep all our members, we just do not have the financial wherewithal to do so carte blanche. Our membership will probably be below 700 in 2025. This drop in membership has severely impacted our ability to provide our customary services to our membership, such as our newsletter and our ability to absorb the per capita and hospital assessment of members in distress.

All requests for assistance are kept confidential and we want to keep you a Shriner!

Have you paid your 2024 dues?

Noble it is October and many of you have not paid your 2024 dues.

Electronic notices for 2025 dues have gone out last month.

The bylaws of both Shriner's International and Al Koran Temple require payment of dues by the first of the year. If you have not paid your dues by January one, you are not in good standing and are unable to participate in Shrine functions as a Shriner.

Unlike the blue lodge, Shrine does <u>not</u> have a program where Nobles attaining 50 or more years do not have to pay dues.

Al Koran understands that many of our senior members are no longer able to attend Shrine functions as they used to and will work with our senior members should they need assistance with their dues

As of September first, I have 66 noble who have not paid their 2024 dues. Al Koran <u>will not</u> carry these Nobles into 2025. Should your dues not be paid by noon of December 31- 2024 you <u>will</u> be suspended for nonpayment of dues.

Treasurer's Report

The Good:

- US economy adds 206,000 jobs, beating expectations of 191,000.
- S&P 500 hit a new all-time high in July.
- Dow Jones Industrial Average hit a new all-time high in July.
- Nasdaq hit a new all-time high in July.

The Bad:

- Total US Federal debt has hit \$35 trillion for the first time in history. Since 2020, the US has now added nearly \$12 trillion in Federal debt.
- Entitlements (Social Security, Medicare, and Medicaid) + defense + interest spending now consume nearly 120% of tax receipts. Up from 60% in 2016.
- Unemployment jumps to a 4-year high of 4.1%.

The Interesting:

- The difference between non-farm payrolls and the household survey is now 3 million jobs since Q4 2021. The household survey only counts workers once, even if they have multiple jobs. Whereas the non-farm payroll will count a worker twice if they have two separate jobs.
- 356 companies have filed for bankruptcy this year, higher than during the 2020 pandemic and higher than any period in the last 13 years.
- President Joe Biden announces he will not seek re-election in 2024 and has endorsed Vice President Kamala Harris.
- President Donald Trump was shot and survived an assassination attempt during his rally in Butler, Pennsylvania. Ronald Regan, in 1981, was the last incumbent or former president who was shot.
- FedWatch Tool is predicting a 95% chance of a rate cut in September.
- Gold hits \$2,500/oz for the first time ever.
- President Trump spoke at the 2024 Bitcoin Conference in Nashville.
- Price changes: January 2000 to June 2024
 - o Hospital Services: 256%
 - o College Tuition and Fees: 187.9%
 - o Childcare and Nursery School: 139.3%
 - o Overall Inflation: 84.9%
 - o Clothes: 1.1%
 - o Cellphone Services: -41.6%
 - o TVs: -97.9%




Hunter's Unit
