Milli shares burn survivor journey, reminder to families one year after serious injury

15-year-old Milli (Left), pictured with physical therapist Jenni, reflects on her care journey nearly one year after she sustained a serious burn injury. Milli spoke with the Dayton Daily News about the night that changed her life when the fumes from an accelerant used in a table-top fire pit ignited, setting Milli on fire.

She was rushed to Shriners Children's Ohio where she says the team not only treated her physical injury, but also helped her realize the burns don't define her.

"They might change, they might give me a little scar or whatever, but that doesn't make me any less beautiful than I was before." Milli said.
